The University of Pécs, with its 25,000 students, over 5,600 international students, 2,400 lecturers and researchers, and 10 faculties, is one of Hungary's largest higher education institutions and the centre of knowledge within the Transdanubian region. Its roots date back to 1367.

About us

The University of Pécs set the internationalization of the institution as a strategic and development priority. As part of this the UP offers more than 100 full and several short training programmes in English as well as in other foreign languages. Beginning in June 2016, short training programmes await foreign students in the framework of a unique summer “trimester”. One of the main objectives of internationalization is to duplicate the number of foreign students studying at the University of Pécs before 2020, so the city of Pécs can become an even more pulsating intercultural centre in Eastern-Central Europe. Thanks to its extensive networks of partnership and exchange programmes with excellent universities in Europe, the United States and Asia, at the moment there are approximately 5 100 foreign students studying at the University of Pécs, coming from more than 136 countries.

Teaching system

Due to the successful implementation of the Bologna education system, students can get involved in a dynamic, interoperable European higher education system. Instead of taking the traditional college and university courses, students first acquire an undergraduate (BA or BSc) degree, and then a Master's degree (MA or MSc). Those students who decided to dedicate some more years to science may apply for a doctoral training (PhD or DLA) as well.

Research and science

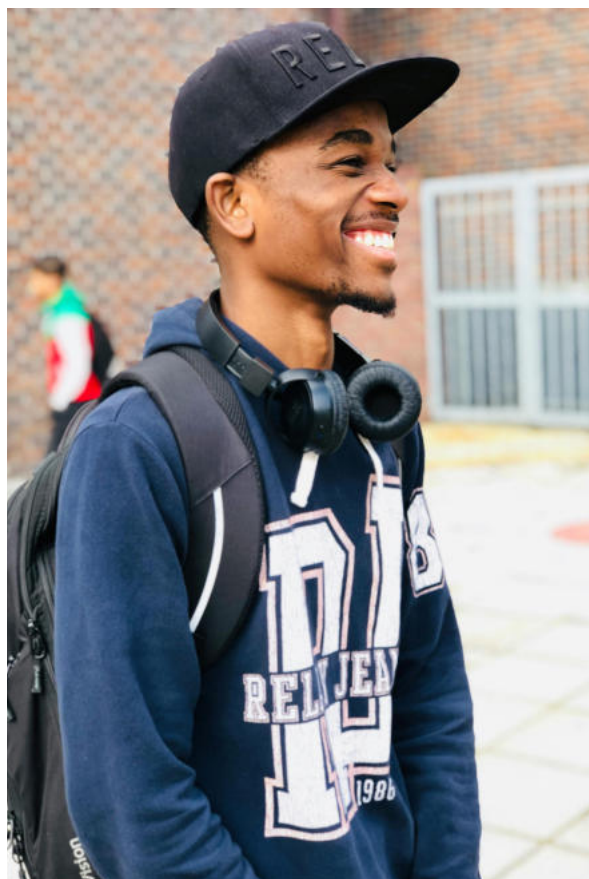
The University of Pécs is one of the leading research universities in the country with a huge professional research background. The Szentágotthai Research Centre is home to a number of medical and scientific researches. The university has 21 doctoral schools which cover a broad spectrum of science and arts. The University of Pécs puts a lot of emphasis on talent management. There are several academic colleges and student circles to support the academic work of UP students.

The University of Pécs is one of the five higher education institutions that bears the title of „Excellent University”. Several high quality research projects representing international standards are being implemented at its ten faculties and the Clinical Centre. Owing to the different profiles of its faculties, the scientific activities of the university are exceptionally extensive, multi-layered and diverse. One can find these activities in the fields of medicine, life sciences, natural sciences, humanities and social sciences as well as fine art, applied arts and music.

What does it mean to be a university student?

Semester Period vs. Exam Period

Semester period: This is when you attend classes, submit assignments and mid-terms, give presentations – in other words, when you actively study.

This is followed by the exam period, when there are no more lectures or seminars, but you must take exams in the subjects that end with one.

What Is a Recommended Curriculum?

The recommended curriculum shows the ideal schedule of subjects for each semester. If you follow it, you will most likely finish your studies on time (e.g. in six semesters). It also helps ensure that subjects build on each other and prevents unnecessary delays.

Credits – What Are They For?

Every university course has a number of credits assigned to it. One credit equals about 30 hours of student work. In one semester, it's advisable to complete about 30 credits, and you need 180–240 credits in total to earn your degree (depending on your program). The more credits you complete, the more progress you make – and you might even become eligible for a scholarship.



Types of Courses – What Must You Take and What Can You Choose?

- Compulsory: everyone must complete these
- Compulsory elective: you can choose from a given group of options
- Free elective: you can take any subject you like – even from another program!

Class Attendance – More Freedom, More Responsibility

At university, you have much more freedom: you create your own timetable, so sometimes you'll only need to attend on a few days per week. But remember: attending your registered courses is still mandatory, and you'll get the most out of the semester if you participate regularly.

What Is Neptun?

Neptun is the online system where you manage everything: course registration, exam sign-up, applications, semester registration, and payments – everything in one place. It might seem complicated at first, but you'll soon get used to it.

How Do You Get Grades?

There are two types of assessment at university:

- Continuous assessment (practice grade): based on assignments, mid-terms, presentations, etc.
- Exam: written or oral, held during the exam period

And What If You Fail a Course?

It happens. You can retake the course and try again. However, if you fail too many courses, you may lose your state-funded scholarship place – which is why it's worth following the recommended curriculum.

What Is a Thesis?

At the end of your program, you'll write a research paper on a topic of your choice – this is your thesis. It demonstrates what you have learned and proves your ability to think and research independently.

When Will You Get Your Degree?

In a bachelor's program, usually after 3–4 years. Some students finish faster, others take longer – it depends on you.

After your bachelor's degree, you can continue with a master's program, then perhaps a doctoral or professional specialization program. You can also decide to start working instead – the key is, the choice is yours.



Full-Time or Correspondence Studies?

Full-time: you attend classes during weekdays – this is your main activity.

Correspondence: classes are less frequent, typically on weekends, allowing you to work alongside your studies.

Minor and Specialization – What Do They Mean?

A minor and a specialization are optional areas of study you can choose in addition to your main program.

A minor consists of a set of courses from another bachelor's program. A specialization deepens your knowledge within your own field. You choose these during your studies, and options vary by program. Important: if you plan to pursue a master's degree later, a well-chosen minor can open new academic or career directions for you!

Our undergraduates develop their knowledge and skills in various methods of the theory and practice of archaeology to achieve successful careers as technicians of excavation projects or as potential members of research groups. You will be suitable for the exploration, excavation and processing of archaeological sources and sites with the help of an archaeologist with master degree, as well as for the management of museum collections. You may be also familiar with other areas of cultural heritage in order to carry out the

basic tasks in all institutions responsible for the exploration, protection, processing and presentation of cultural heritage. In addition, You can be prepared to continue Your studies in the Archaeology M.A. program.

You will experience different teaching, learning and assessment methods including lectures, seminars, individual tuition, group-based, co-operative activities as well as individual and small group research projects. Student-centered teaching foster respectful, attentive and emphatic communication and can improve reasoning and collaboration skills, as well as adaptability.

In the Western cultural tradition liberal arts education has always been the ultimate mark of an educated person, and still today it provides a comprehensive education in the humanities with the foundation knowledge to enter a number of careers in cultural life, education, and government, or to go straight into graduate study in any subject of humanities. The core aim of the curriculum is to develop well-rounded individuals with general knowledge of a wide range of subjects and with mastery of a range of transferable skills. It is designed to enable students to develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills,

effective oral and written communication skills, and a sense of social responsibility. You will be taught in small, interactive seminar groups, encouraging discussion and debate with teaching staff and fellow students.

You will study a combination of required and optional modules, and choose a subject in which you will major, so no two Liberal Arts students have exactly the same programme. The programme offers you outstanding flexibility, balancing breadth of knowledge across disciplines with the opportunity for in-depth study in a field of your choice. The programme is

structured with a system of major - a package of 80 study credits - and minor - 50 study credits to be chosen among the other liberal arts fields - and with required core courses.

Please note that a minimum of four students is required to choose each major and minor in the given year to start that programme.

Structure Overview

Art history

Art History courses combine a comprehensive review of art movements, artists, and artistic media with opportunities to put your knowledge into practice. The programme emphasizes art-historical theories and analytic methods with a strong focus on the visual arts of Europe and North America. It develops students' critical skills and approaches to study and interpret works of art. These skills can be applied in many professions: education, public museums, commercial galleries, auction houses, interior design, fashion marketing, advertising, art journalism, art investigation, art and healing, law and property rights, art and computer software development.



Classical Studies

The programme offers an introduction to the era of classical antiquity, which is considered the essential education for a critically thinking individual knowledgeable in many fields and highly articulate. It provides a sound foundation for studies in European literatures and Western cultural history in general - literary genres, mythology, Greek and Roman religion, arts, philosophy and history of science. By acquiring basic language skills of Greek and Latin, students not only attain knowledge of fundamental issues of general linguistics, but are also provided help in getting acquainted with the Graeco-Latin international vocabulary used in other fields of humanities and social sciences. Typical positions with BA degree include museums and galleries, libraries and archives, tourism (foreign and domestic), cultural project management.

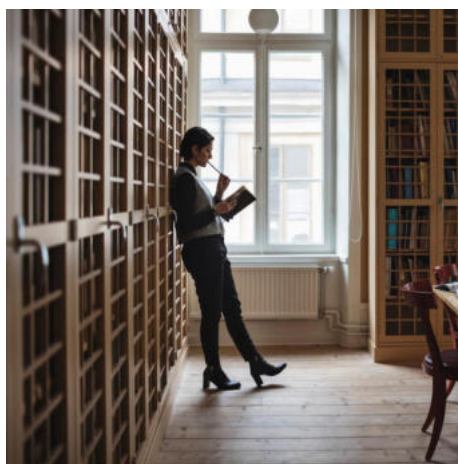
Ethics

With this programme you will gain knowledge of the history moral theories, and examine ethical debates in different fields of application. Courses mostly focus on the history of Western moral philosophy, and on the application of current philosophical thinking in contemporary settings. The knowledge and skills gained in this programme can be applied to a number of current issues. For example, encouraging ethical media practices, ethical principles in emerging technologies, developing policies that benefit the environment. Students will acquire the skills to provide analysis of moral problems and ethical debates and be able to make critical assessments of ethical arguments and policy documents, which are needed in a number of work settings including: education, health care, law, social justice, research and development.

Film and Visual Studies

The purpose of the module is to train professionals who are able to critically analyse and aesthetically evaluate films by giving the students substantial training in film analysis, history, and theory. Special attention is given to the study of Hungarian cinema, the forms and types of film narratives, the social context of cinema and popular culture, and the history and characteristics of experimental/avant-garde film.



Philosophy

The aim of the programme is to provide a thorough, broad and comprehensive historical and systematic education in philosophy. The programme will equip you with the ability to think logically, to evaluate arguments critically, and to challenge your own ideas and those of other people. You will learn about the central philosophical principles, concepts, problems, texts and figures of the Western tradition. Courses will provide you with the necessary knowledge of the history of philosophy and expound on the key philosophical themes and concepts. Seminars will teach you how to read and analyse texts closely, as well as offer well-structured presentations, and write philosophical papers. This degree will offer you a wide range of highly sought-after skills: analytical, evaluative, critical and creative thinking skills.

The **BA in Hungarian literature and linguistics** program is designed to train experts in Hungarian language, literature and culture. The graduates will be equipped with both the academic knowledge and the relevant language and practical skills to analyse literary texts, linguistic and cultural phenomena in their wider intellectual, intercultural and historical contexts. Studying Hungarian language and literature at the University of Pécs entails the development and sophistication of students language and reading skills, as well as their ability to place and interpret linguistic questions and literary texts in their wider intellectual, cultural and historical contexts.

The program also requires the students to consider the methodology by which they analyze the linguistic, literary and cultural phenomena, to learn about contemporary Hungarian language use and literary forms and techniques, and to make comparative analyzes.

You will learn about the history of the Hungarian language, literature and culture since the beginnings up until the 21st century. The program offers also a great number of courses in comparative literary and cultural studies. The program allows for a considerable degree of choice that students can make about the topics they would like to concentrate on. You can choose after completing the foundation

courses one from the following specializations:

- Literary Criticism
- Language and Culture
- Hungarian as a Foreign Language

You will be assisted in building key competences such as critical thinking, academic writing and reading, intercultural transfer and translation, comparative analysis, professional cooperation, assertive communication, openness to other people and other cultures, deep respect for professional and human dignity as well as for religious, ideological and cultural diversity.

You will experience different teaching, learning and assessment methods including lectures, pro-seminars, seminars, master-seminars,



individual tuition. Our teaching model, the so called „Pécs-model”, is based on tutoring and mentoring of small research groups working on different scientific projects and doing social and cultural activities. We practice a student-centered teaching-model which fosters the respectful, attentive and emphatic communication and can improve reasoning and collaboration skills, as well as adaptability, creativity and performativity.

You will be offered a training in academic Hungarian language and writing in order to activate and extend your linguistic competences and to increase your confidence in using written and spoken Hungarian in professional discussions. The courses of this training are designed to improve your academic vocabulary, as well as your speaking, reading and writing skills.

You will be equipped with both the academic knowl-

edge and the relevant language and practical skills to build up a career as an expert in Hungarian language, literature and culture.

You will be able to interpret literary texts, linguistic and cultural phenomena to make comparative analyses, to translate different types of texts, to contribute to interlingual and intercultural communication.

You will be qualified to continue your studies at **Master level (MA)**.

The curriculum includes different study methods, combining lectures and seminars with individual tutorial courses and the opportunity of an “on the spot” practical training in archives and museums. It also includes visits of relevant historical sites. A competent staff member will be assigned to you immediately after the beginning of the first semester as a tutor (in accordance with the topic of your intended thesis) who will supervise you in writing your thesis and provide continuous consultation.

The curriculum aims to be interdisciplinary: this character is reflected in the subjects of the shared mandatory courses to be taken by all students regardless of the chosen chronological specialization, and in the range of fields covered within the given specialization (e.g. palaeography, iconography, history of ideas). The Medieval and Early Modern History specialization and the Modern History specialization give equal weight to General History and Central European History: Hungarian History is presented as part of Central European History.

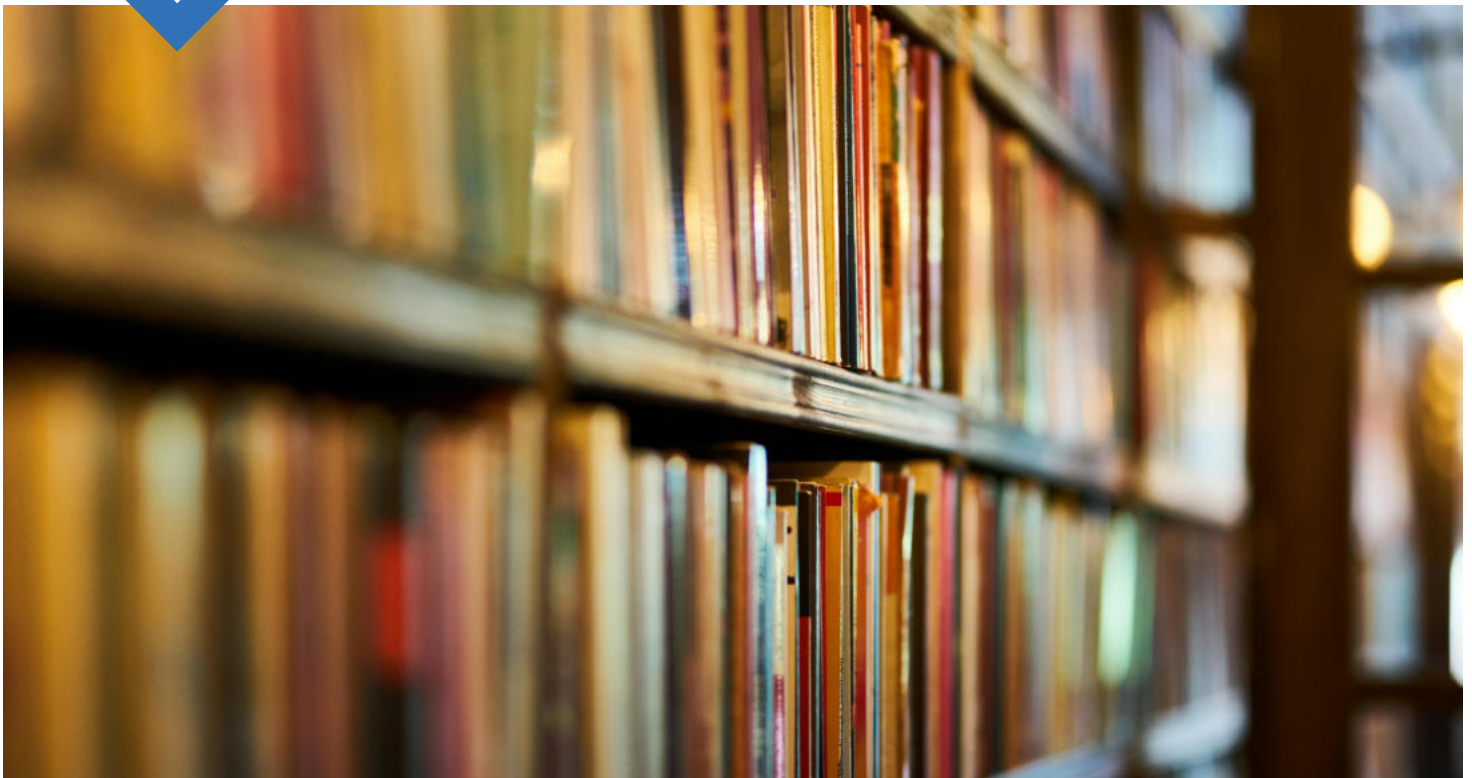

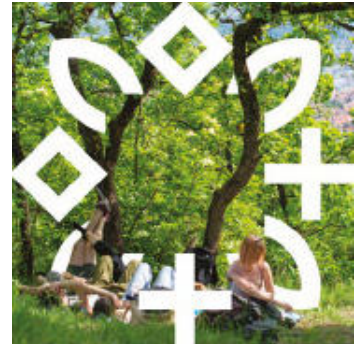

The MA program in Sociology at the University of Pécs, Department of Sociology offers students the opportunity to address social, demographic and policy issues from an applied research perspective. We focus on providing students up-to-date courses on social theories and social problems which serve as the basis for planning and conducting empirical research, utilizing quantitative and/or qualitative data from multiple sources. The goal of the program is to train experts who possess skills to address social problems and opportunities, excel in data analytics, and can visualize and communicate research results for various audiences. The applied knowledge our students gain is sought after by employers in multiple domains and is key to contemporary academic research.

Throughout the four semesters of our program, lectures and interactive seminars offer theoretical studies ranging from the classics to contemporary social theories covering key topics of

sociology such as education, gender, media, urban, rural and demographic processes. Courses on empirical methods assist students in acquiring high-level knowledge in an applied setting, with a track of seminars dedicated to independent research projects covering the whole research spectrum from the formation of a study topic to the selection of research methods, their implementation in data analysis, culminating in the presentation and dissemination of research results on diverse platforms. Students looking for careers in and outside academia receive career coaching to realize their plans.

As the MA program in Sociology specializes in Data Analytics, several courses will be dedicated to the theory and application of statistical methods in academic and non-academic scenarios. Students will learn to use multiple methods at an advanced level (such as classifiers, methods of dimension reduction and multivariate modeling techniques), and acquire strong skills in data

visualization and interpretation using the R programming language among other available tools.

In sum, the MA in sociology with data analytics specialization might be for you:

1. If you are interested in understanding current social challenges from a sociological perspective.
2. If you want to gain applied analytical skills, particularly in data analytics.

The program offers graduates in psychology, biology, medicine and other social sciences the opportunity to broaden their theoretical and practical knowledge to achieve new scientific results. Courses will cover, but will be not limited to, topics such as social cognition and social representation, psychophysiological measurements, and qualitative and quantitative research methods.

The study program consists of two separate blocks (Semesters 1-4, Semesters 5-8). During the first block, doctoral students master advanced research skills and take theoretical courses which help them to elaborate their own research plans and design their exper-

iments. At the end of the 4th semester, students' knowledge and research progress is assessed by a complex examination, which is a prerequisite for continuing doctoral studies. In the second block, intensive interaction between students and their supervisors is encouraged. Students are expected to focus mainly on their research, but also participate in teaching activities in order to prepare for a carrier in an academic environment. Research results have to be published in peer-reviewed journals and presented at conferences. A doctoral thesis must be submitted not later than the end of the 8th semester. After a succesful thesis defence, the applicant will be awarded a PhD degree in psychology.

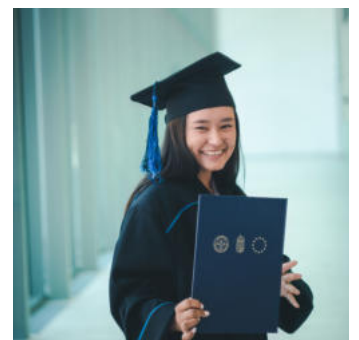
