

Society and Health Studies


Language of instruction:	English
Form of teaching:	lecture
Class hours per week:	2
Credits (ECTS):	8
Course description:	The course provides students with an eligible framework for the critical analysis of health related social dilemmas, e.g., the question of social/community and individual responsibility for improving one's health. Problems of financing and organizing health services are discussed.
Assessment methods:	Attendance, presentation
Teaching period:	Spring Semester

**Operation of Human Services**

Language of instruction:	English
Form of teaching:	lecture
Class hours per week:	2
Credits (ECTS):	8
Course description:	The goal of the subject is to enable students to orient themselves in the arena of human services. In addition to the detailed description of the services provided by specific actors, issues of regional differences, effectiveness and efficiency, contemporary changes in legislation and their impact on the services, as well as problems and organization issues of service management are discussed.
Assessment methods:	Mid-term test, final test

Social Context of Human Development (Social Psychology)

Language of instruction:	English
Form of teaching:	lecture
Class hours per week:	2
Credits (ECTS):	8
Course description:	The course familiarizes students with the basics of social context of human development and facilitates the understanding of social influence on life-long personality development, cognition, behavior and identity. The course unit integrates the basics of developmental psychology with social contexts and processes of identity and personality formation, in determining major factors and milestones of psychosocial development. In the frameworks of the course students are familiarized with main theories of personality. By completing the course, students will be able to integrate these knowledges into their own professional areas.
Assessment methods:	Mid-term test, oral presentation, final test

**Theories of Social Work**

Language of instruction:	English
Form of teaching:	lecture
Class hours per week:	2
Credits (ECTS):	8
Course description:	The aim of the course is to provide students with comprehensive knowledge on social work as a profession: its theoretical foundations, history, perspectives, values, major fields and professional activities. The course also familiarizes students with basic professional documents, first and foremost, the Code of Ethics for Social Work.
Assessment methods:	Mid-term test, oral presentation, final test

Language and Social Communication in the Helping Professions


Language of instruction:	English
Form of teaching:	lecture, seminar
Class hours per week:	2
Credits (ECTS):	8
Course description:	The course introduces social worker students into the study of social communication. Students understand how people build their communities and cultures via communication; and explore the relevance of communication issues in social work as a helping profession.
Assessment methods:	Attendance, joint discussion, presentation
Teaching period:	Spring Semester

**Introduction to Empiric Social Research**

Language of instruction:	English
Form of teaching:	lecture, seminar
Class hours per week:	2
Credits (ECTS):	8
Course description:	The aim of the course is to provide students with an overview of the underlying ideas, objectives and methods of social work research. Students gain an insight into evaluation and developmental and participatory-empiric approaches in research work. They are required to practice the different methods during the classes, and also as home assignments.
Assessment methods:	Mid-term papers, research
Teaching period:	Spring Semester

Special Policy Issues of Life-span Development


Language of instruction:	English
Form of teaching:	lecture, seminar
Class hours per week:	2
Credits (ECTS):	8
Course description:	The course discusses the political endeavours related to specific life phases. This course is compulsory for students of Social Work BA program, but is open for students of other programs as well. In the course, different aspects of the life-span development are discussed, concentrating on the needs and on the public policies related to the different life cycles.
Assessment methods:	Written and oral exam
Teaching period:	Spring Semester

**Public Health & Epidemiology**

Language of instruction:	English
Form of teaching:	lecture, seminar
Class hours per week:	2
Credits (ECTS):	8
Course description:	<p>This course will provide an overview of theories and empirical knowledge about social, biological and behavioural determinants of health including environmental and lifestyle factors, sustainable development (such as climate change) as determinants of health.</p> <p>Students will be familiarized with the basics of epidemiological approach.</p>
Assessment methods:	Active participation, assignment, reflective diary
Teaching period:	Spring Semester

Family Consultation

Language of instruction:	English
Form of teaching:	lecture, seminar
Class hours per week:	2
Credits (ECTS):	8
Course description:	<p>This course is designed to strengthen students' understanding and application of family consultation.</p> <p>This eight-credit course is designed to strengthen students' theoretical and practical understanding as well as application of family consultation.</p>
Assessment methods:	Active participation, assignment, reflective diary
Teaching period:	Spring Semester

**Social Work with Communities**

Language of instruction:	English
Form of teaching:	seminar
Class hours per week:	2
Credits (ECTS):	8
Course description:	The course is designed to introduce students in theories, practices and methods of social work with groups and communities. By completing the course, students understand the role groups and communities have in promoting social welfare, social inclusion and citizen participation; and in enhancing personal wellbeing through enablement and empowerment. Students interpret groups and communities from a holistic and systemic approach, relying on principles of social network theories. Students reflect on the symbolic structure (values, traditions etc.) of communities; and understand the importance of community work in challenging barriers, inequalities and injustices that exist in societies. Further, they should acquire knowledge on major group processes and dynamics that govern human interactions and behaviour. By adopting a strength-based perspective, they understand the relevance of volunteering and mutual aid orientation.
Assessment methods:	Video analyses, writing a reflective journal week-by-week
