Course syllabus

Title:	Cultural Heritage of Pécs
Credit points (ECTS):	4
Term:	Fall
Module leader:	Dr. Zsuzsa Koltai, Dr. Iván Zádori
Aims:	<p>The course is designed for students who are willing to learn about the cultural heritage of Pécs and the city's historic involvement. The course provides opportunities for visiting heritage attractions. Heritage is seen not only as a memory base of communities that needs to be preserved but bestowed for the benefit of future generations as a resource that can trigger innovation. Beyond introducing the history of Pécs the course focuses on the major cultural achievements and the most important cultural heritage sites of Pécs.</p>
Learning outcomes:	<p>There is much to explore in a 2000-year-old city. Students could discover the rich and vivid history from the Roman period through to the „Cultural Capital of Europe” – phase (2010) and the big year of the 650th anniversary of founding the University of Pécs (2017) till the present. The course provides unique opportunities for visiting heritage attractions. Competencies include transdisciplinarity, and cross-cultural competencies as well.</p>

The Exhibition of the University History, The Founding of the Medieval University. The first Public Library established by Bishop Klimo. (Dr. Zádori)

Learning and teaching strategy:

The course starts with the syllabus review and students get a general overview of the history of Hungary and Pécs. The next classes provide opportunities for visiting heritage attractions and students gain experiences on site.
