Course title: 1. Chamber singing

Neptun code: 22PRE019

Language of instruction: English

Location: Pécs Campus

Form of teaching: seminar

Form of assessment: final oral presentation on the topics of semester with authentic performance

Course description:

The aim of this course is to learn the well positioned singing with an expressional singing voice in order to reach the ability of the authentic, 'true to style' performance. The course provides an introduction to the European chamber singing from Renaissance till the period of Romanticism. The course supplies students with awareness and competencies in the fields of suitable vocal technique and chamber singing in different music historical periods-born pieces.

Course objectives:

Students will learn:

- the importance of European literacy in chamber music;
- the significance of the different music historical periods of Europe;
- national music differences;
- learn about background sciences.

Students will be able to

- realize an expressive voice in singing;
- realize an understanding of the different music situations;
- demonstrate experiences in their chamber music making practice.



Course content:

- vocal training;
- European masterpieces from different music historical periods.

Knowledge: Students in the course:

- learn the essence of chamber singing, the special skills and competences required for teachers' musical activities, as well as their experiential music education; learn the musical, psychological and pedagogical aspects and contexts that can be used in their later music education work;
- are familiar with the process of personalization of music of a certain age group according to their educational programme;

Ability: Students:

- acquire the skills necessary for the development of authentic performance and music education in order to develop children's age-related, relevant musical skills and abilities;
- possess the knowledge and music skills acquired during the course, with advanced knowledge,

Course description:

The aim of teaching the module is to place the students' foreign language competence on a solid foundation and to further develop it, thus contributing to the development of intercultural competence necessary for European socialization. Within the framework of the module, the integrated development of language skills and abilities of special importance, in which independent student work plays an important role, thus shaping the students' need for continuous self-education and self-development that goes beyond the duration of the training.

**Course title: 3. Foundations of Cultural Studies****Neptun code:** 20PRE037**Language of instruction:** English**Location:** Pécs Campus**Form of teaching:** Lecture

Form of assessment: Short written dissertation. Overall, the work during the semester, the quality of the written paper and the activity shown during classes are going to be part of the final rating

Course description:

The main reason of the course is to introduce foreign students into Hungarian culture with the help of the most famous, beloved and internationally well-known novels. Learning about Hungarian literature the students can develop a deeper understanding of other cultures, histories, habits and roots, which can also make it easier to fit into the Hungarian everyday life. Reading these novels also helps them utilize their language skills and their literacy.

During the course the students will read four Hungarian novels in English (or, if there's a translation in their own language). They are going to create a reading diary, in which they have to write about the plot of the texts, the impact of the story – which character is the most interesting and why, end so on.

In each class, there will be a brief summary given about the writer of the current novel, along with some background information concerning the author.

During the courses the opinion of students about the novels will be discussed highlighting the importance of the literary works in question.

**Course title: 4. Introduction to Child Protection****Neptun code:** 22PRE027**Language of instruction:** English**Location:** Pécs Campus**Form of teaching:** lecture**Form of assessment:** Written essay.**Course description:**

The objective of this course is to equip students with fundamental legal knowledge in the field of family and child protection law. Students will gain an understanding of the current legal frameworks and regulatory structures they will encounter in their professional practice. A primary focus will be on key legal institutions related to family and child protection, including matters concerning marriage, domestic partnerships, child status in family law, and the structure of child and family protection services and institutions.

Recognizing child protection issues, understanding the competencies and operations of child protection institutions, defining the legal status of families and children, and exploring the various benefits and services available to them are fundamental components of the course. Additionally, students will develop a foundational understanding of the functioning of service-providing institutions, eligibility conditions for social benefits, and access to legal remedies in this domain.

Topics to be discussed:

- **Fundamental Legal Concepts:** Social norms, legal norms, legislation, legal sources, Hungary's hierarchy of legal sources, legal relations, types of legal entities, legal capacity, legal acts, legal enforcement.
- **Constitutional Foundations and State Structure of Hungary.**
- **The Family as a Legal Institution:** The role, significance, and protection of the family in domestic and international law.
- **Marriage and Family Law:** Personal relations between spouses, matrimonial property law, legal implications of domestic partnerships.
- **Kinship and Family Law:** Family status, adoption, parental authority, obligations of relatives, guardianship.



- **Child-related Financial and Social Benefits:** Family support benefits (1998. évi LXXXIV. törvény), health insurance benefits (1997. évi LXXXIII. törvény), and other allowances for supporting child-rearing (1997. évi XXXI. törvény).
- **Legal Principles and Sources of Child Protection Law:** Rights and obligations of parents and children (1997. évi XXXI. törvény).
- **The Social Welfare System (1993. évi III. törvény):** Child welfare services, child protection services, and specialized childcare services.
- **The Child Protection System:** Institutional care, guardianship, and child protection administration.
- **Legal Practice in Family Law:** Participation in judicial proceedings.
- **Legal Practice in Child Protection Administration:** Administrative procedures and case management.

From the second half of the 20th century, it becomes increasingly obvious that economic, social activities of humankind and resource use are not without limits and put an increasing burden on the environment not only locally but globally as well. This course is concentrating on the most important elements of the topic of sustainability and draws attention to the importance of environmental education and education for sustainability. The development of environmental education and sustainability in recent decades has brought significant progress in both educational and socio-economic practices. However, global environmental changes and the continuous evolution of sustainability challenges require new approaches and innovations in methodology as well at the different levels of education: in this course the methodology used in preschools is in focus.

Topics to be discussed

- Environmental education, education for sustainability
- Environmental education in kindergartens
- Methodology of preschool environmental education
- Case studies, presentation

- The course provides an overview of the music materials in kindergarten with an emphasis on theoretical foundations, curricular concepts, and principles of music instruction.
- It focuses on approaches/methods, and materials needed to teach music for children, and prepare students with experience-oriented music education.
- Acquisition and true-to-style performance of kindergarten music material
- Practice-oriented customization of the theoretical-methodological knowledge

Topics to be discussed

- Developing students' musical performance skills
- Recorder playing – the most common modified notes, transposition
- methodological knowledge and procedures that are necessary for music education
- video analysis of kindergarten music project
- Designing one lesson plan

Course title: 8. Singing and Solfege

Neptun code: 22PRE014

Language of instruction: English

Location: Pécs Campus

Form of teaching: seminar

Form of assessment: final oral presentation on the topics of semester with authentic performance

Course description:

The course introduces the concept of Hungarian music pedagogy and to the so called Kodály-Method. By the end of the course the students will develop competencies in the areas of the most typical approach of Hungarian music teaching. In this course students will widen both of their theoretical and practical knowledge along with their routine as well.

Course objectives:

Students will learn the:

- importance of European music pedagogy;
- music pedagogical principles of the Kodály-Method and its music pedagogical tools.

Students will be able to:

- demonstrate development of target music skills in their music making practice;
- demonstrate experiences in their solfege making practice.
- realise an understanding of the different music situation.

Course content:

- history of music pedagogy
- principles of the so-called Kodály-Method;
- solmisation
- different exercises in connection with the given music materials' problems (tonality, modulation, rhythm etc.)
- video-analysis

The aim of this course is to prepare the students for visual instructor work with children between the ages of 3-6 in preschools and kindergartens. Through real and experimental practice, they become familiar with the techniques of visual arts and the characteristics of materials. Aesthetic skills and the ability to know the way how to read and value children's art and how to transmit appreciation of different kinds of adult art will be acquired. After getting comprehensive theoretical knowledge in the range of visual education the students will be able to plan and carry out curriculum ideas consciously. They will be acquainted with the features of different ages of small children, and further how to encourage their development and creativity.

Topics to be discussed:

- basic terms of visual arts and the process of visual perception and physiology of eyesight
- definition and interpretation of visual education
- development of self through art
- methodology of visual education in preschool and kindergarten
- tools of fine arts and children's self-expression
- development of children's visual expression correlate to their environment along with the development of artistic activity, such as drawings of children parallel with their intellectual development
- considering children's art
- curriculum planning
- the way of helping special educational tasks in the preschools and kindergartens by visual education

Form of assessment: exam

Course description:

The course gives an introduction into the topics relevant for the professionals in counselling, education and social support when working with families. We cover the basic and most prevalent theories of family therapy and aspects of child development in evaluating and resolving problematic situations that might arise in the context of education. By examining the life cycles of individuals and of the development of families we map the most sensitive periods and the pitfalls arising from these in the emergence of problems in family life, that are relevant from the point of view of education.

Objectives:

The course gives an overview of the most important theories of family therapy and work on professional work with families and offers practical guidelines for solutions. At the completion of the course the students will be able to:

- use practical guidelines and tools for the resolution of the problems education professionals might encounter in their professional career
- effectively tackle and settle the question and dilemma at hand
- understand the systemic aspects of families and the role of educators in the handling problems experienced by children in their development
- have efficient skills of communication in coordinating school life and family events

- Introduction: what is family counselling
- Systemic perspective in dealing with families
- Diagnoses in family counselling



- Early models and fundamentals of working with families
- Family developmental cycles, psychosocial influences
- Classic schools in professional work with families

Form of teaching: Seminar

Form of assessment: Form of evaluation: practice mark (plan + activity + analysis),

Course description:

- To take part in activities that provide practical knowledge;
- to make notes about their daily experiences in their Pedagogical Diary;
- To prepare for the P.E. activity in accordance with the mentor/program leader;
- Regarding the present methodological field, to prepare for leading the activities, especially the play activity, and P.E activity
- To do observations of the group before leading the activities in order to know the kids.
- To prepare a process plan, based on the instructions of the program director kindergarten teacher / mentor. The plan should consider the kids' actual age and developmental level accordingly, the pedagogical, psychological and methodological knowledge. The plan should be handed over by the date agreed upon and 2 days prior the activity the latest.
- To plan, prepare and provide the necessary materials. To prepare and show the materials by the date agreed upon.
- To apply the pedagogical, psychological and methodological knowledge in leading the routine tasks and the developing activities focusing on the children's individual needs and abilities on the day of the practice.
- To analyze and evaluate the everyday, routine tasks based on the criteria set in the Study Plan and on the pedagogical, psychological and methodological knowledge.



Other duties

- To join the play activity and to use the model sentences, methods applied by the kindergarten teacher
- To lead everyday P.E. activities in play time

Requirements

- To gain experience on the overall educational work in the kindergarten.
- To know the possibilities of organizing learning activities
- Leading the play activity according to the daily schedule, to fulfil daycare duties, to lead P.E. activity.

Course title: 18. Pedagogical Social Psychology

Neptun code: 22PRE022

Language of instruction: English

Location: Pécs Campus

Form of teaching: seminar

Form of assessment: Class participation and final essay.

Course description:

The aim of this course is:

- to develop students' complex competences necessary for adequate and effective teacher decision-making through a practice-oriented understanding of the pedagogically relevant theories of psychology.
- to make students aware of the phenomenon-explanatory and decision-support potential that educational psychology can offer to an educator, thereby arousing their interest and desire for knowledge.
- to develop students' intellectual habits of analyzing social situations and problems in terms of social psychological factors and mechanisms.

Topics to be discussed

- Basic concepts of educational psychology and social psychology
- Comparison of primary and secondary socialization (tasks, educational methods, effects), exploration of their interrelationships.
- Perception of the personality. Methods for understanding and developing the child's personality.
- Attitude: Pedagogical-psychological approach to deviation from the mean.
- Group of pupils, assessment, theory and practice of the sociometric method.
- The possibilities and methods of developing groups of pupils.
- Individual and environmental conditions affecting the effectiveness of learning
 - o Motivation factors for learning. Rewards, punishment.
- Teacher leadership styles → Disciplinary methods and their effects.
- Communication in the institution. Institutional conflicts and ways of dealing with them.



- Child abuse
 - o Bullying and its management.
- Pedagogical-psychological analysis of experiences of pedagogical practice.
- Characteristics of the role of the “mature” teacher.
- Mental health of the teacher.
- Psychological problems of teacher's work.
- Characteristics of stress, coping, burnout.

**Course title: 19. Preschool Education****Neptun code:** 20PRE043**Language of instruction:** English**Location:** Pécs Campus**Form of teaching:** Seminar

Form of assessment: The confirmation of the fact that students on the completion of the course will be able to understand the factors of harmonic and healthy development between ages 3-7. They have understood the methods of education and development of complex personalities and have mastered the professional, scientific knowledge needed for its implementation in practice. They understand the levels of preschool education, the modalities, the framework and the possibilities and the interaction of these levels. They understand the needs and requirements of a healthy development and fruitful educational methods targeted at the preschool age group. They understand the socio-cultural background and its effect on complex developmental issues.

Course description:

Preschools are studied as an institution, as a place and atmosphere for education.

The course will touch up on the subjects of:

- Developmental psychology of preschoolers, preschool education features and characteristics.
- Facilities and special areas in preschool education.
- Social and cognitive development in preschool.
- Linguistic development and the cognitive revolution.
- Targets, goals and aims of preschool education.
- Modalities in preschool education: music, visual art, verbal development, linguistic and cognitive development.
- Special education and disadvantaged populations – autism and social-cognitive deficits affecting communication.
- Psychosocial development.
- Special features of preschool years in psychological and cognitive development.
- Individual education and socialization in preschool. Piaget, Erikson, Vygotsky and their views on preschool years development.
- Differentiation as a paradigm in preschool education.
- Project method in preschool years – advantages, possibilities, applied frameworks and the cooperative stance in education.



- 21st century skills in preschool education. Preschool teacher's responsibilities, tasks and needs for successful functioning – communication patterns and Gordon's method. Preparation for school. Flexible frameworks of entering elementary school. Social values and family values in education – experience and gamification as a tool. Family and preschool cooperation in education and development.

Attitude

Students must be motivated to learn and become good educators, are therefore prepared to be subject to life-long-learning. Can select the appropriate from a variety of methods available. Can integrate several needs keeping the pedagogical goal in mind. Has an inclusive view in preschool education, nurturing and embracing the needy and the disadvantaged. Accepts that preschool methods must support the child's personal psychological development. Has an inherent need to be self-reflective, is motivated to deepen their knowledge of the self and psychological reflective abilities to prevent burnout.

Autonomy and responsibility

The students becoming professionals as a result of the course undertake the responsibility that goes with their profession. They are motivated to support the physical, emotional and psychological development of preschoolers. They take responsibility for providing a nurturing environment, in providing the physical environment, objects and personal qualities needed for the harmonic development of children of this age. They undertake the responsibility to control and predict the consequences of their practical work and functioning and to ensure the results and consequences of their pedagogical behavior and program support and nurture children's development in harmonic ways. They consciously coordinate their methodology to be efficient and child friendly.

The course gives an introduction to the scientific factors research, describes methodology in scientific experiments and prepares students for their thesis writing, offering tips and research techniques.

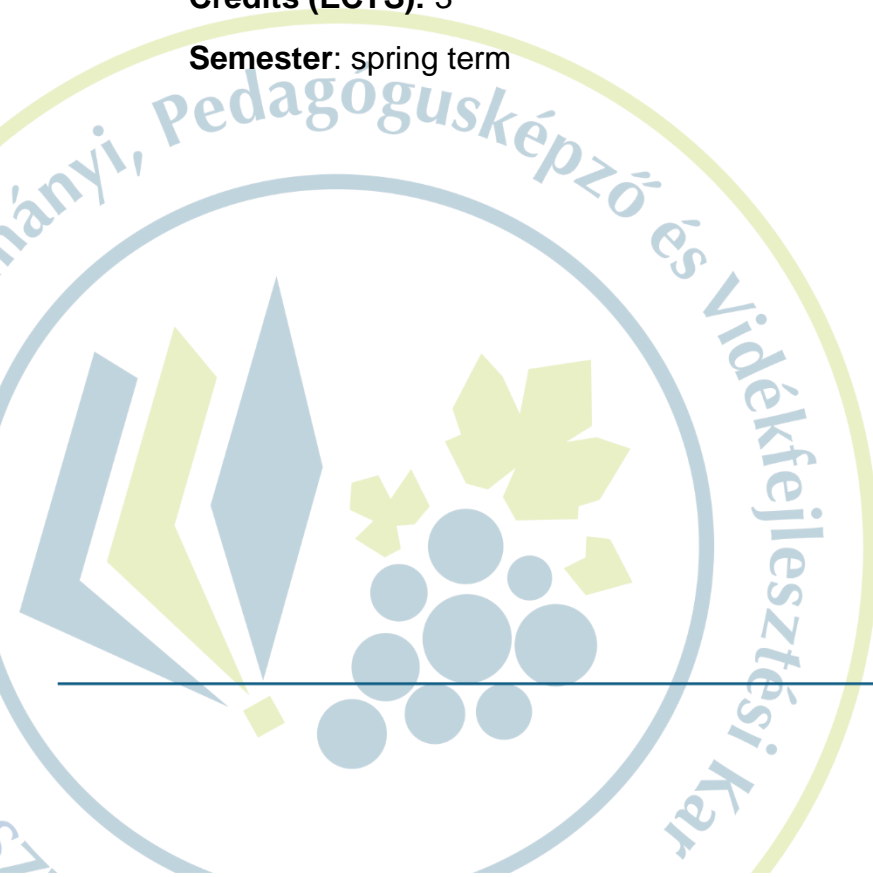

**Course title: 21. Theory of Education****Neptun code:** 20PRE034**Language of instruction:** English**Location:** Pécs Campus**Form of teaching:** lecture**Form of assessment:** Students are required to compile their own project method-based assignment.**Course description:**

The course gives an overview of several theories in the science and practice of education and pedagogy. It builds on the course of Introduction to Pedagogy, and goes deeper into methods, approaches and applied techniques in didactics and 21st century educational practices.

The course offers different approaches to teaching, theoretical backgrounds of the techniques and helps understand the scope of each method by mapping the focus of the given pedagogical platform.

Objectives:

We first look into the basics in child development to understand the needs of the child being taught, the different fields in pedagogy ranging from social intercultural issues in the classroom to applied methods of special needs and purposes; we look into timely issues of integration and inclusion, techniques and importance of mindfulness, some methods for special education like atypical development, and look into specific techniques of preschool practices in online teaching. Eventually we target a widely acknowledged method called the Project Method, highlight its advantages, specific features and usefulness in integration, in democratic and special education.

- Theories of education – basic approaches in pedagogy, reform pedagogy
- Education and integration
- Social integration in preschool, techniques and need for inclusion
- Mindfulness and techniques for effective learning

**Course title: 23. Creativity Development Practice****Neptun code:** KLÉ005**Language of instruction:** English**Location:** Pécs Campus**Form of teaching:** lecture**Form of assessment:** Evaluation based on students' performance and practical assignments (term mark).**Course description:**

Creativity seems to be the most important soft skill of the 21st century and crucial for professionals in all fields. This course is intended to support and complete any field of study

by motivating the participants to open their minds to innovative methods. Through creative

exercises, they will acquire skills to connect various things and absorb information in a way

that they can use later in life. The content of the contact hours will help students to see things

differently, improve their observational skills and serve as a creative warm-up. The course

will improve creativity through techniques of visual arts (such as free-form drawing, painting,

printing, collage, paper cutting and folding, contemporary art techniques), and playful exercises requiring mindfulness.

Students will gain more confidence, find and develop their individual voice and style. It is a course for exploration through trying new things, experimenting, while not excluding even the possibility of making occasional mistakes. It is recommended for all levels and fields of interests, although especially students who are interested in visual arts may improve their drawing, painting skills or even interpreting forms and space. Experience gained in this course will improve the participants' flexibility in coping with unexpected situations and their performance in daily life and at their future workplace.



Every lecture will begin with a short overview of the theoretical background related to the topic. Thereafter the contact hours always consist of studio practices and interactive plays. Students will work alone, in pairs and in teams as well. At the end of the course students will show final presentations followed by class discussions.

- Discussion of creativity and creative thinking.
- Discussion of creative experiences and the linkage between creativity and the visual arts.
- Visual games without artistic materials and tools.
- Working with different materials and textures.
- Nature and the use of natural materials.

- Final presentation of students and class discussion.

Course description:

The course is designed for students who are willing to learn about the cultural heritage of Pécs and the city's historic evolvement, there is much to explore in a 2000-year-old city. Discover the rich and vivid history from the Roman period through to the „Cultural Capital of Europe” – phase (2010) and the big year of the 650th anniversary of founding the University of Pécs. (2017) till the present.

The course provides opportunities for visiting heritage attractions. Heritage is seen not only as a memory base of communities that needs to be preserved but bestowed for the benefit of future generations as a resource that can trigger innovation.

Beyond providing an introduction to the history of Pécs the course focuses on the major cultural achievements and the most important cultural heritage sites of Pécs.
