

CALL FOR APPLICATION

The University of Pécs Medical School calls for applications for participating in the Pannónia Scholarship Program Student Mobility for Learning Programme for the autumn semester of the 2024/2025 academic year

The object of the call for applications:

Long-term student mobilities for study purposes are student mobilities based on interinstitutional agreements, implemented with the purpose of obtaining credits, and directed to specific target countries, the duration of which is a **minimum of 2 months and a maximum of 5 months**.

Student mobilities for academic purposes can be implemented in any study area and cycle, including doctoral training. The study period abroad must be part of the student's study program aimed at obtaining a diploma within any study cycle, and the sending institutions must accept it and fully comply with the curriculum structure in terms of the time of student mobility in a proportional manner. The credit acquisition and recognition process must be recorded in the mobility agreement of the student participating in the mobility.

Duration of study mobility abroad: minimum 2 months - maximum 5 months

Period of study mobility: August 25, 2024 - February 10, 2025

Currency of the scholarship: HUF

Pannónia Scholarship Program students studying abroad:

- spend 2-5 months abroad (depending on the year they are in and the partner institution);
- do not pay tuition fee at the receiving institution; however may be obliged to pay registration/administration fee (mainly at German universities);
- enroll at the University of Pécs Medical School, establish an active student status, pay any
 applicable tuition fees to their home university, and receive their grants for the period of
 studying abroad;
- do not obtain their degree before ending the mobility;

Other information:

- The Medical School guarantees students 100% recognition of the credits earned abroad, provided that the conditions for the recognition of the credits are fully met: the activity carried out during the student's learning mobility must be accepted by the sending institution and fully correspond to the curricular structure.
- In order to obtain 100% credit approval, the student must apply to the Faculty Credit Transfer Committee (hereinafter referred to as the "CTC") for a preliminary credit transfer procedure for the subjects to be included in the application immediately after submission of the scholarship application. Only subjects that have been approved 100% in advance



by the CTC may be included in the Learning Agreement. If the preliminary credit transfer procedure has not been completed by the deadline for submission of the Learning Agreement, or if the CTC does not approve any of the subjects to be included, parties shall not sign the Learning Agreement.

• The conclusion of the Support Agreement is only possible if there is a Learning Agreement signed by all three parties. Completion and compliance with the courses agreed in the Learning Agreement is binding for both the student and the institutions.

Who can apply?

General participation conditions:

- the student is pursuing undergraduate or doctoral studies aimed at obtaining a diploma at the institution;
- the student has 1 completed active semester at the time of application;
- in the semester in which the mobility takes place, the student has an active student status at the Faculty; and do not obtain their degree before the end of the mobility period;
- the student has a high communication level of English and/or language competences corresponding to the native language of the destination country (minimum B2 but recommended C1);
- the student is allowed to participate in a study mobility period for a maximum of 12 months per academic cycle, regardless of the number or type of mobility activities
- meet the application requirements announced by the given faculty.

Required documents to be submitted:

- A copy of any official language certificates (a high school certificate is not an official language certificate)
- **Professional CV** (English or German language, depending on the host institutions(s))
- **Motivation letter** (English language- approximately 1500 characters)
- Transcript of records from the previous 1 completed semester for first-year students, from the previous 2 completed semesters for upper-year students

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Professor's recommendation letter

Optional documents to be submitted:

- **certificate(s) of scientific and research activities** (please include the number of semesters you have spent performing the activity).
- **certificate(s) of volunteering activities** (please include the number of events and the exact time spent (hours) on them).

Grants for the academic year 2024/2025:

The amount of the grant depends on the length of the study period (number of days) and on the host country.

Students who provide documentary evidence of social needs are entitled to an additional support of HUF 100,000 per month, in addition to their individual support provided within the framework of the Pannónia Scholarship Program.
