Concert by Tenore Supramonte de Orgósolo (Cagliari) Contributor: Stefano Pinna (launeddas)

Canto a Tenore (A Tenore singing) is the definition of a complex performance practice of oral tradition which is reserved for specialized singers trained by long apprenticeships. The musical structure involves four parts each of which is performed by a single voice. Every performance is initiated by a leader voice called sa bo'e (literally "the voice") who gives the tune, the tempo, the speed, the length, and the pitch change. It is also the only part which sings the lyrics. The other parts are called mesu-bo'e (half-voice), contra and bassu: they sing stereotyped successions of nonsense syllables. The voices are characterized by peculiar vocal techniques, including typical timbres with throat sounds. In 2005, the a Tenore singing has been included in the UNESCO Immaterial Cultural Heritage program.

The a Tenore singing is not a simple legacy of the past but a contemporary form of musical communication adopting complex improvisational skills. In some villages it is frequently performed by men of all ages, being at the core of the social life. One of such village is Orgosolo, a veritable capital of the tradition with hundreds of specialized singers. The Tenore Supramonte is one of the best-known and most highly regarded groups in all Sardinia, with a long experience of concerts outside the island.

The launeddas is an extraordinary wind instrument with three reed pipes that are played simultaneously by means of the circular breathing technique (inspiration through the nose, expiration from the mouth, maintaining a continuous flow of air in the reeds). The longest pipe is called tumbu and plays a drone note on the lowest note. The medium pipe (the mancosa), has four square holes and is held in the left hand. The shorter pipe, also with four holes (mancosedda), is held in the right hand. At the bottom of the two melodic pipes there is also another hole, the arrefinu, which has a tuning function.

The launeddas is used on various occasions both in religious and secular contexts, ranging from the religious processions to the accompaniment of traditional circle dancing. Furthermore, the instruments have an important virtuoso use which determines a strong rivalry amongst the main players.

Currently launeddas are widespread in south central Sardinia. Stefano Pinna is a young exponent of the traditional school of Cabras launeddas. He is a real virtuoso player of the instrument, already considered a true master. He has given numerous concerts throughout Sardinia and abroad.

LEENALCHI Venue: E78

LEENALCHI is an alternative pop band consisting of two bass players, a drummer and four vocalists. The band was formed in 2019. They performed their first show as the 53rd stop of the Hyundai Card Curated concert series, and have also performed at Zandari Festa and Pentaport Rock Festival, among others. They burst into the public consciousness with their first album, 2020 (Sugungga), Tiger is coming, and despite 2020 being the year of the rat, the band's unique sound has made 2020 the "year of the tiger" in Korean music. The band has proven that traditional pansori and modern music can go hand in hand. At the 18th Korean Light Music Awards, the band was honoured in three categories, including "Musician of the Year" and "Best Modern Rock Song", and has been a huge hit on YouTube with 600 million views. The band is also active in other areas besides performing, and was recently asked to perform the theme song for the Apple TV series "Warbler", which they produced.
